On The Landscape Architectural Technology Program, NAIT

The Alberta Association of Landscape Architects (AALA) recognizes a Landscape Architectural Technologist membership category as part of its current regulations and bylaws. The impetus for the membership category has been the Landscape Architectural Technology (LAT) program that was created in 1974 at the Northern Alberta Institute of Technology (NAIT) in Edmonton.

LAT began as a second year option in Architectural Technology and has evolved into a full 2 year diploma program. NAIT has the only accredited program for Landscape Architectural Technologists in Canada. The AALA accredits the program as part of the Canadian Society of Landscape Architects Accreditation Program. Articulation agreements are in place with the University of Guelph and University of Idaho that allow for a selection of NAIT students to transfer credits towards a degree in Landscape Architecture at these universities.

The LAT program develops students' skills in architectural drafting, detailing and design, communications, presentation, specification, estimation and supervision. Students are required to have a laptop computer for the duration of their studies at NAIT. The use of laptop computers provides the students with the opportunity to learn widely used professional software. Upon completion of the diploma, students develop their careers in private and public consulting and the construction industry.

There are currently 40 LAT members in the AALA constituting about 20% of the total membership. We are fortunate to have in Alberta, this educational opportunity for students and to be able to draw from the LAT program, graduates to work in our industry helping to maintain and foster this vital profession of Landscape Architecture in Alberta and throughout Canada.
