Student Grant Recipients

Yvonne Cardoso, University of Guelph, Master's Programme

Research Goal

To design landscape narratives to stimulate critical thinking and thereby, raise environmental awareness of Tommy Thompson Park among three target audiences. The proposed audiences, at this time, are children and school groups that use the park, park users and the Toronto Region Conservation Authority (TRCA) Board.

Grant Awarded \$2,000

Edith Normandeau, Université de Montréal, Maîtrise en aménagement-Option Paysage

Research Goal

Les végétaux comme éléments du paysage sonore : relation qualitative entre conditions environnementales, morphologie et organisation spatiale des végétaux dans la production d'ambiance sonores, Jardin botanique de Montréal. Nous souhaitons signaler l'importance de qualifier les ambiances sonores associées aux végétaux car plus qu'un phénomène banal, elles peuvent influencer nos processus de conception et permettre une analyse qualitative de notre environnement.

The plants as soundscape (sound landscape) elements: qualitative relation between environmental conditions, morphology and spatial organization of plants in production of sound atmospheres at Montreal Botanical Garden. We hope to point out that it is important to describe sound atmospheres produced by plants because they are more than banal phenomenon. They can influence our conception (design) process and permit a qualitative analysis of our environment.

Professional Grant Recipients

Tracy Penner, BLA, Environmental Landscape Design Consultant

Research Goal

A post occupancy evaluation of school ground naturalization is required to measure viability and to establish whether involvement of a landscape architect improves long-term success. There is a strong established movement to increase natural areas on school grounds and hundreds have been built. The role of the landscape architect varies from leading the entire planning and implementation process to no involvement at all. Is there any correlation between the involvement of landscape architects in the design process and the longevity of the projects?

Grant Awarded \$6,000

James Taylor, FCSLA, FASLA, Professor Emeritus, University of Guelph

Research Goal

To publish the completed manuscript on Canadian Professional Practice that would be available for purchase as a resource to students (university and college programmes in landscape architecture and landscape technology), practitioners and candidates for the LARE or other examination processes.

Grant Awarded \$10,000

The CSLA / AAPC Lifetime Achievement Award and the CSLA / AAPC Teaching Award.

The CSLA - AAPC Lifetime Achievement Award is awarded to a landscape architect whose lifetime achievements and contributions to the profession have had a unique and lasting impact on the welfare of the public and on the environment.

Nomination

Nominations may be made by any Member of the CSLA, any component organization of the CSLA, or by any associated organization of the CSLA.

The Nomination package must include the following:

- a letter of nomination describing the qualifications of the nominee to receive the Medal (no more than five pages in length);
- a photo of the nominee (as applicable); and
- additional supporting materials such as photographs of projects, articles and up to five (5) letters of endorsement.

Eliaibility

The individual must be a landscape architect. Nominations are not limited to members of the CSLA or to citizens of Canada.

The CSLA - AAPC Teaching Medal recognizes an individual who has made a substantial and significant contribution to landscape architecture education.

Nomination

Nominations may be made by any Member of the CSLA, any component organization of the CSLA, or by students in landscape architecture programs of education.

The Nomination package must include the following:

- a letter of nomination describing the qualifications of the nominee to receive the Medal (no more than five pages in length);
- a photo of the nominee (as applicable); and
- additional supporting materials and a minimum of three (3) and a maximum of five (5) letters of endorsement.
- One (1) letter by a full member of the CSLA.

Eligibility

Nominees must be full time or emeritus landscape architecture faculty members who have made sustained, significant contributions to a landscape architecture program of education.

Upon receipt of nominations, the CSLA Board of Directors will determine the recipients for each of these awards by closed ballot. One award will be presented annually at the CSLA Congress.
