

## CSLA Legacy Project Award Nomination Guidelines and Form

<p><b>Purpose</b></p>	<p>The CSLA Legacy Project Award is intended to recognize distinguished landscape architecture projects which:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ were forward-thinking for their time</li> <li>○ contribute significantly to their communities</li> <li>○ showed leadership and innovation, and</li> <li>○ are still relevant examples of excellence in the profession of landscape architecture.</li> </ul> <p>The purpose of the award is to honour:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ projects which have left and continue to leave a lasting impact on Canada's landscape</li> <li>○ the landscape architect(s) instrumental in the project's conception, maintenance or revitalization, and</li> <li>○ the client, responsible for the project's maintenance and continued development.</li> </ul> <p>The award will provide an opportunity to recognize and develop awareness of important projects in communities across Canada.</p>
<p><b>Eligibility</b></p>	<p><b><i>Nominators</i></b></p> <p>CSLA Components and Affiliates may nominate one (1) project per year. Nominations will only be accepted from CSLA Components and Affiliates.</p> <p><b><i>Nominees</i></b></p> <p>Projects nominated for the award must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ have been completed at least 20 years ago</li> <li>○ continue to be in operation or use</li> <li>○ be accessible by the public</li> <li>○ be located in Canada.</li> </ul> <p>Examples of nominees include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ public parks</li> <li>○ conservation areas</li> <li>○ protected natural landscapes</li> <li>○ plazas</li> <li>○ streetscapes</li> <li>○ zoos</li> <li>○ botanical gardens</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o sculpture gardens</li> <li>o river walks</li> <li>o projects distinguished by the exceptional involvement of a landscape architect.</li> </ul>
<b>Frequency</b>	<p>A maximum of one CSLA Legacy Project Award may be awarded annually. Nominations which are not selected for the award may be re-submitted in future years.</p> <p><b>Restrictions</b></p> <p>A project may only receive one CSLA Legacy Project Award.</p>
<b>Judging Criteria</b>	<p>The following criteria, among others, will be considered by the jurors:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o the project's durability – whether it has stood the test of time and left a lasting impact on Canada's landscapes and communities</li> <li>o the project's sustained value to the community it serves</li> <li>o the programming that may occur at the site</li> <li>o the continued relevance of the project's design expression.</li> </ul>
<b>Nominations and Selection</b>	<p>Nominations must be made on attached nomination form.</p> <p>The nominations are to be reviewed and selected by the CSLA Awards of Excellence jury. Judging is normally held in Winnipeg in February.</p>
<b>Deadline</b>	<p>All submissions must be received at the component association by <b>Friday, 4 January 2019 at 4:30 p.m. (local)</b>.</p> <p>Component associations must submit endorsed nominations to the CSLA Awards of Excellence Team c/o Department of Landscape Architecture in the University of Manitoba by <b>25 January 2019 at 4:30 p.m. (central)</b>.</p> <p>Late or incomplete applications will not be accepted.</p>
<b>Announcement</b>	<p>The Award recipient is notified by the CSLA President. The award will be remitted either during the CSLA Congress or at a special event at the project location.</p>
<b>Presentation</b>	<p>A national press release will be issued and the owner of a representative of the winning project agrees to be available for media interviews, should they be required. An on-site presentation ceremony may also be coordinated by the CSLA. In addition, the recipient will be featured on the CSLA website and in the CSLA's various communications, such as the Bulletin and the magazine, <i>Landscapes/Paysages</i>.</p> <p>Entrants whose submissions win a CSLA Legacy Project Award may be required to make available to the CSLA further information in the form of images, original drawings or models that may be suitable for promotion, exhibition, publication or other promotional purposes. All entrants should note that the CSLA assumes the right to use any submitted material for any promotional endeavor that the CSLA deems fit.</p> <p>Finally, a plaque with the details of the award will be provided by the CSLA for display on-site.</p>

<i>Submissions must include</i>	<p>The Nomination package must include the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ the completed CSLA Legacy Award Nomination form;</li><li>○ a description of why the project should receive the Legacy Award, the project's and importance, the impact of the project's leadership and innovation and its current relevance (maximum 500 words)</li><li>○ a description of the role of the landscape architect or firm in the project's design, development, execution, protection or maintenance</li><li>○ a description of how the site functions on a yearly basis (maximum 250 words)</li><li>○ a description of how the project has changed from its original design/conception</li><li>○ 10-20 images (in .jpg format) of the project (historical images may be included)</li><li>○ Maximum of five (5) letters of recommendation about the impact the project has had on the community</li><li>○ Letter of support from the owner (if applicable)</li></ul> <p>Optional Requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ One (1) maximum 3-minute video</li></ul>
