

# CSLA and Components Associations Terms of Reference

Terms of Reference between the Canadian Society of Landscape Architects and the following component landscape architecture associations:

- Atlantic Provinces Association of Landscape Architects
- Association des architectes paysagistes du Québec
- Ontario Association of Landscape Architects
- Manitoba Association of Landscape Architects
- Saskatchewan Association of Landscape Architects
- Alberta Association of Landscape Architects
- British Columbia Society of Landscape Architects
- Nunavut Association of Landscape Architects
- Northwest Territories Association of Landscape Architects

#### Objective

The objective of these terms of reference is to define the relationship between the Canadian Society of Landscape Architects and the nine component associations. It is intended to outline the areas of activity and responsibilities of each, and to encourage the pursuit of common projects and shared values that can be expressed nationally.

As such, this document comprises a framework guiding the respective undertakings and responsibilities of each organization in furthering shared objectives.

### **Founding Principles**

The CSLA and the component associations exist to develop, educate, promote and advocate the benefits of landscape architecture and landscape architecture as a profession. The main principles of the terms of reference are:

- 1. Sharing a common goal of collaborating in furthering the profession of landscape architecture and protecting the public interest.
- 2. Collaborating where possible in their initiatives to take advantage of opportunities to further the objectives of the organizations, such as providing services to members.
- 3. Avoiding duplication of efforts where such duplication leads to inefficiencies.
- 4. Actively encouraging cross-pollination of resources and ideas with a goal to streamline the delivery of member services.
- 5. Through the CSLA Board, providing a forum for components to share their unique concerns and perspectives thus strengthening understanding, reciprocal communication and collaboration at a national level

## Membership

All full or regular members of the component associations and life members shall be members of the CSLA, in accordance with the provisions, procedures, and applicable schedules, as set forth in the CSLA and components' by-laws.
